Town Highway Garage relocates to Basin Road

The Town of Hurley Highway Department Garage has relocated to 35 Basin Road in West Hurley after its former location, at 1035 Dug Hill Road in West Hurley, was posted as "unsafe."

The "unsafe" declaration was made by Town Code Enforcement Officer Tom Tryon on Jan. 24, 2023, the result of a "Building and Structural Analysis Report" prepared by Kingston-based Lockwood Architecture and received by the town on Jan. 23, 2023. Lockwood conducted its inspection on Dec. 14, 2022.

Among the key points in Lockwood's report were cracks in the building's floors and walls, the presence of noxious gasses, mold accumulation on the roof trusses, and the trusses being structurally questionable.

Additional problems cited by Code Enforcement Officer Tryon included exterior walls deteriorating, the rear garage settling, part of the concrete slab being undermined, and the electrical system not being up to code. Tryon additionally noted a lack of smoke, fire and carbon monoxide alarms; improper storage of combustible materials; and a lack of compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Lockwood, in its report, recommended the Dug Hill Road building "be demolished in its entirety."

Home-delivered meals available for seniors



Ulster County seniors can have frozen meals delivered to their homes at no cost.

The program, provided by the county Office for the Aging, has its meals planned by a registered dietitian. Each meal provides one-third of a senior's daily nutritional needs.

A week's worth of meals is delivered once per week.

Those receiving the meals must be 60 or older and live in Ulster County, and must have difficulty preparing their own meals.

How to deal with Central Hudson billing issues



Ulster County offers Central Hudson Gas & Electric Corp. customers the following suggestions for how to deal with billing problems.

* For issues with rate increases, billing or meter reading errors, of automatic withdrawals, call Central Hudson's Customer Service Department at (845) 452-2700 and ask for your bill to be amended.

- * If the problem is not resolved satisfactorily, file a complaint with the New York State Department of Public Service online at dps.ny.gov/file-complaint. Provide detailed information about your billing issues, including dates, bill amounts, and the steps you've taken to resolve the issue.
- * The Ulster County Executive's Office has opened an investigation with the state Department of Public Service into Central Hudson's billing practices. Customers can add comments about their experiences with the company at the website tinyurl.com/2s46kyxk.
- * If your electricity is in imminent danger of being shut off, or has been shut off, call the office of State Sen. Michelle Hinchey at (845) 331-3810.
- * Customers can update an existing complaint, or request a case status, online at dps.ny.gov/file-complaint.


