

Town earns Bronze status from NY Climate Smart program

Hurley is one of 19 localities in the state to earn Climate Smart Communities certification this year. The honorees were announced on April 21.

To achieve Climate Smart certification, local governments accumulate points for planning and implementing actions that reduce greenhouse gas emissions and improve community resilience to the impacts of climate change. The certification report for Hurley, which lists actions the town took to be certified a Climate Smart Community, can be viewed online at tinyurl.com/2p9a54hn.

Established in 2009, the Climate Smart Communities program provides guidance and technical support to local governments to take locally driven climate action. The first step to becoming a Climate Smart Community is pledging to reduce emissions and adapt to climate change. To date, 377 local governments representing more than 9.4 million New Yorkers have adopted the Climate Smart Communities pledge.

Earth Day cleanup crew targets town Transfer Station area

Ron Gibbons Sr. is Memorial Day Parade Grand Marshal



The Grand Marshal of this year's Hurley Memorial Day Parade on Monday, May 29, will be Ron Gibbons Sr., who served in the U.S. Navy near the end of and after World War II and has lived in Hurley for 62 years.

Gibbons, 95, was drafted in June 1945 and was assigned to the San Francisco-based USS Hornet CV-12 aircraft carrier with the rank of Fireman First Class (F1C).

A native of Gloversville, NY, Gibbons said 14 people in the one-block area where he grew up served in the U.S. military during World War II.

After serving in the Navy, Gibbons (shown in the photo at left in the Town Hall on Monday, May 11, 2023) attended Rider College in New Jersey and then Champlain College in Plattsburgh, NY, where

he played center on the varsity football team. After college, he worked for General Electric in Schenectady – where he discovered he and a colleague had served simultaneously on the USS Hornet – and then for IBM in the town of Ulster, from which he retired in 1990.

But Gibbons isn't fully retired. You can find him at Lowe's in the town of Ulster, where he's been employed for 15 years and currently works in the Garden Department from 6 a.m. to noon every Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday.

"If you sit, you're going to vegetate," he said of why he still holds down a job. "You have to keep moving."

Gibbons also worked as a crew member on the Hudson River tour boat Rip Van Winkle for four years.

Gibbons lives on Hilltop Drive in Hurley with his wife of 65 years, Mary. He has four children and numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren. He is a member of the American Legion.

Look for him in the Grand Marshal vehicle during the Hurley Memorial Day Parade, which starts at 10 a.m. May 29 at the THikit print shop, 185 Zandhoek Road. The parade will proceed northwest on Zandhoek Road, turn right at the end of the Hurley Cemetery property, cross Hurley Avenue, travel the length of Main Street, cross Wynkoop Road, turn left on Wamsley Place and end in front of the Town Hall, where there will be a ceremony, hot dogs and beverages.

The parade route is about 1.5 miles. The route map can be found online at tinyurl.com/5n6n8ud2.

The Hurley Heritage Society Museum, which is along the parade route at 52 Main St., will have a bake sale on its front lawn during the parade, with fresh-brewed coffee and bottled water available.

Primary Day is June 27; important deadlines approaching

Primary Day is **TUESDAY**, **JUNE 27**, **2023**. Only people registered in a political party can vote in that party's primary.

Important dates:

- The last day to apply for an absentee ballot for the primaries is MONDAY, JUNE 12.
- The voter registration deadline for those who want to vote in the primaries is SATURDAY, JUNE 17.
- Early voting for the primaries begins on SATURDAY, JUNE 17, and ends on SUNDAY, JUNE 25. Complete information about early voting, including locations, can be found online at elections.ulstercountyny.gov/early-voting.

To determine the location of your Primary Day polling place, go to the website vic.ntsdata.com/home/ulster and enter your residential address.

Dispose of household hazardous waste at June 25 event



The Ulster County Resource Recovery Agency will accept household hazardous waste from county residents, at no cost, on Sunday, June 25, 2023.

The event will run from 8 a.m. to noon at the RRA site, 999 Flatbush Road (Route 32) in the Town of Ulster.

The event is for Ulster County residents only, and no commercial waste will be accepted. Appointments for drop-off must be made in advance at tinyurl.com/3p9u6zvb.

Power outage tried to kill time, but we beat the clock!

The clock stopped during a power outage on Feb. 2, 2023, and failed to restart when the power was restored a few hours later. Our best guess is a surge occurred when the electricity came back on and fried the clock's motor, causing time to stand still – at least metaphorically.

We then had to endure a long delay waiting for a new motor from an

out-of-state vendor, but it finally arrived in late April and was installed by our building maintenance staff on Monday, May 1.

Bronx Zoo bus trip planned for July 8

The Hurley and West Hurley libraries, along with the town, are sponsoring a bus trip to the Bronx Zoo on Saturday, July 8.

The bus will depart at 8 a.m. from Kingston Plaza – near the baseball field at the Hannaford end of the property. The bus will leave the zoo for the trip home at 4 p.m. and arrive back in Kingston about 6 p.m.

The cost of \$20 per person covers transportation and zoo admission, which includes access to the zoo's Star Attractions: the Bug Carousel, Butterfly Garden, Children's Zoo, Congo Gorilla Forest, JungleWorld, Nature Trek, Wild Asia Monorail and Zoo Shuttle.

Lunch can be brought from home (no glass bottles) or purchased at the zoo. Tips for the bus driver are optional.

Advance payment, by cash or check only, is required to secure a spot. Tickets can be purchased at the main desk of either library (Hurley at 48 Main St., West Hurley at 42 Clover St.). Town residents can buy tickets starting May 22; sales will be open to the general public starting June 19. All ticket sales are final. No refunds will be available for cancellations.
