

Draft of 'Comprehensive Plan Update' available online

The draft of Hurley's "2023 Comprehensive Plan Update" was completed just as this issue of the town newsletter was ready to be printed, so it was too late to include details. But the entire draft, about 60 pages long, and several supporting documents are posted on the town website, townofhurley.org.

Highway Department starts brush pickup on April 24



The town Highway Department will begin picking up brush on Monday, April 24. Pickup in West Hurley will start on that date. Pickup in Old Hurley will start on Monday, May 1. Once pickup has been completed in a given area, crews will not return there.

West Hurley residents should place their brush at the edge of the road the weekend of April 22-23. Residents of Old Hurley should do so the weekend of April 29-30.

Brush should be placed at a 45-degree angle to the road (see diagram), making it easiest for a loader to pick it up and place it in a truck.

Brush items should be no larger than 4 inches in diameter and 6 feet in length, and no yard debris or leaves should be mixed in.

There will be no brush pickup at homes located on state highways.

Outdoor brush burning banned in NY through May 14



New York's annual ban on the outdoor burning of residential brush began March 16 and will remain in effect through May 14.

Fires in backyard pits are allowed, as are campfires less than 3' in height and 4' in length, width or diameter. Small cooking fires also are allowed.

The state ban, which aims to reduce the risk of wildfires, has been enforced every spring since 2009.

Tennis anyone? Come to the park!

With spring now in full swing, tennis enthusiasts can enjoy court time at the town park on Dug Hill Road in West Hurley.

One of the two courts (pictured) is currently available for use during daylight hours. The other was awaiting new parts for the netting assembly, which the town expected to receive by April 21.

Hurley Memorial Day Parade planned for May 29



The town's 2023 Memorial Day Parade will be on Monday, May 29.

The staging area – the THikit print shop at 185 Zandhoek Road (formerly St. John's Mission) – will open at 9 a.m. Participants should arrive by 9:15 a.m. (enter from Zandhoek Road and park in the grassy area on the right), and the parade will step off at 10 a.m.

The parade will proceed north on Zandhoek Road, turn right at the end of the Hurley Cemetery property, cross Hurley Avenue, travel the length of Main Street, cross Hurley Mountain Road, turn left on Wamsley Place and end in front of the Town Hall, where there will be a ceremony, food and beverages.

The parade route is about 1.5 miles. The route map can be found online at tinyurl.com/5n6n8ud2.

The Memorial Day Parade, sponsored by the Town of Hurley, will be on **Monday, May 29, 2023**. The staging area at 185 Zandhoek Road (formerly St. Joseph's Mission, now THikit print shop) will open at 9:00 am and **participants should arrive no later than 9:15 am**. Enter the staging area by way of Zandhoek Road. Parade participants parking there should park in the grassy area on the right when driving in.

The parade will start at 10 am at 185 Zandhoek, proceed north up Zandhoek Road and end at Town Hall, 10 Wamsley Place.

Please note: Each parade participant wanting to hand out candy or other items to children watching the parade must have a walker handing out items directly to the children. For the safety of all involved, we cannot have any items thrown into the street. No political entries or signs. Animals must stay off private lawns and cleanup must be provided.

We encourage everyone to become a participant in the 2023 Memorial Day Parade. All are welcome. If you know anyone that would like to participate in the parade, please have them contact the Supervisor's Office. Let's make this the best parade yet! All entries must be received by May 1, 2023.

Trees and shrubs added to O&W Trail in Hurley



New trees and shrubs were planted along O&W Trail in Hurley at the end of March and beginning of April.

The plantings are intended to improve the trail's natural beauty and appeal, and provide additional habitats for birds, insects and other wildlife.

Among the new plantings (two of which are shown in the photo at left) are shagbark hickory, black

chokeberry, gray dogwood, red twig dogwood, American hazelnut, bottlebrush buckeye, pussy willow and American holly.

The project was overseen by the New York State Department of Transportation, which granted a landscaping contract for the work.

The plantings cover a stretch of nearly a mile along the trail, starting at the Russell Road parking lot and heading south.
