Credit, debit cards now welcome at Transfer Station



Credit and debit cards are now being accepted for payments at the town Transfer Station, 1043 Dug Hill Road, West Hurley.

The Transfer Station accepted cash until the end of 2022, when the state barred the practice. The site then switched to accepting payments only by check, money order or pre-purchased coupon card as it waited for the installation of infrastructure needed to accept credit and debit cards. That's now in place.

All major credit cards, including American Express and Discover, are accepted at the Transfer Station, as are debit cards. Also, there is no added fee for customers who use credit or debit cards.

(NOTE: Existing coupon cards still can be used at the Transfer Station, and they remain available for purchase at the Transfer Station and Town Hall for people who prefer that method of payment.)

The Transfer Station operates from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday, though it's closed on Tuesdays during weeks with a Monday holiday.

Town secures \$80,000 grant for improvements at park

The town has been awarded an \$80,000 Ulster County Parks and Recreation Grant that will be used to make improvements at the town park on Dug Hill Road in West Hurley.

The town was notified July 6 that its grant application was approved.

The money being provided to Hurley is from American

Rescue Plan Act funding that Ulster County received from the federal government.

Planned improvements at the park include creating an accessible walking trail, renovating the kitchen in the building attached to the pavilion (pictured), and adding grass to the property, among other things. A timetable for the work has not yet been established.

NY State's new 'Hunting & Trapping' guide available



The 2023-2024 "New York Hunting & Trapping" guide, issued by the State Department of Environmental Conservation, is now available to the public.

The guide, about 80 pages long, provides information about licensing, hunting areas, hunting for big and small game, turkey and migratory game bird hunting, and furbearer hunting and trapping. It also includes maps, safety tips regarding tree stands, information about using hunting dogs, and sunrise and sunset times, among other things.

Hard copies of the guide (pictured), which is the size of a magazine, are available for free in the Town Hall, 10 Wamsley Place, and can be picked up during weekday business hours (9 a.m. to 5 p.m.).

HOW WE SERVE YOU: Town of Hurley Assessor's Office

"How We Serve You" is a new, regular feature of the town newsletter that aims to familiarize Hurley residents with the functions of the town's various departments and offices, and provide examples of when their services would be required. This month, we focus on the Town Assessor's Office.



The main function of the Town Assessor's Office is to estimate the value of real property within the town. The assessor is obligated by New York State to maintain assessments at a uniform percentage and keep track of all inventory on a property.

The assessor also keeps track of and reviews every sale of a property in the town, approves and keeps records of property tax exemptions, and conducts inspections of such things as new construction and improvements/additions.

Examples of why a Hurley resident would need to contact

the Town Assessor's Office include inquiring about property tax exemptions, disputing the assessed value of a property, inquiring about a parcel's acreage, updating a mailing address for tax bills, and notifying the town about a name change.

New owners of properties should be aware they no longer can register with the Town Assessor's Office for New York State's Basic STAR credit and must register directly with the State Office of Taxation. If you own your home, it's your primary residence, and your yearly income is \$500,000 or less, you are eligible for the Basic STAR credit. You can register for it at tax.ny.gov/star or (518) 457-2036.

Annual renewal applications for the low-income senior tax exemption will be mailed this coming fall and must be returned by March 1, 2024.

The current Town of Hurley Assessor is Brittany Santarelli. Her office is in the Town Hall at 10 Wamsley Place. She can be reached by phone at (845) 331-7474, option 4; or by email at assessor@townofhurley.org.

Please note: The Hurley Assessor's Office does not maintain tax bills. Hurley property owners looking to obtain a copy of their town property tax bill should contact the Town Clerk's Office, and those looking for their school tax bill should contact their school district's tax office.

Town government report: Board approves 9 resolutions

The Town Board approved nine resolutions when it met on Tuesday, July 18, in the Town Hall.

In attendance at the meeting were Town Supervisor Melinda McKnight, Deputy Supervisor Pete Humphries, and Councilmembers Michael Boms and Gregory Simpson. Councilwoman Jana Martin was excused.

All the resolutions, which are listed below, were approved by unanimous 4-0 votes. The full text of each resolution can be viewed online at **tinyurl.com/mv5jetav**.

1. Appointed Greg Terault to the Conservation Advisory Committee.

2. Ratified a Memorandum of Agreement for the Collective Bargaining Agreement with unionized employees of the Town of Hurley Highway Department.

3. Hired Erin Stewart as Building Department Clerk.

4. Accepted the Town Court's quarterly audit.

5. Authorized Town Court Clerk to attend the annual conference, in September, of the NY State Association of Magistrates Court Clerks.

6. Authorized Town Justice John E. Parker to attend the New York State Magistrates Conference in October.

7. Authorized the Town Supervisor to sign easements related to drainage improvement projects in the vicinities of Kemble Terrace and Wildwood Drive.

8. Hired three summer interns.

9. Authorized a title search for the Old Hurley Burial Ground.


