Concert at church benefits Hurley Heritage Society

Local roots/rock band Professor Louie & the Crowmatix (pictured at right) will perform a benefit concert for the Hurley Heritage Society on Friday, March 31, 2023, at the Hurley Dutch Reformed Church, 11 Main St.

Seating begins at 7 p.m., and the concert starts at 7:30.

The concert will include music from the Professor Louie & the Crowmatix's 2022 release "Strike Up the Band," along with selections from its album "Music from Hurley Mountain" and earlier releases. Professor Louie & the Crowmatix also covers songs by The Band and others.

Heritage Society hosts lecture on Colonial women



On Thursday, March 23, The Hurley Heritage Society will host a lecture called "Imagining Colonial Women in the Hudson Valley," given by Dr. Susan Ingalls Lewis (pictured at left), Professor Emerita in History at SUNY New Paltz.

This will be an online event, starting at 7 p.m. There is no cost to view the lecture, but preregistration is required at the website tinyurl.com/2vr5pfs3.

The Colonial-era women who lived in what would become New York State represented a diverse group of races, cultures, religions, national backgrounds and socioeconomic classes. They ranged from indigenous people to those of Western European descent; from religious refugees to enslaved Africans to capitalists.

Dr. Lewis' lecture will focus on the many ways women shaped the history of the Hudson Valley between 1609 and 1775. There also will be a short addendum on New York women's experiences in the American Revolution.

Professor Emerita Lewis, who lives in Rosendale, is an author; co-editor of "Suffrage and its Limits: The New York Story (SUNY Press, 2020); and a former affiliate faculty member of the Women's Gender and Sexuality Studies Department at SUNY New Paltz, where she taught courses in American History, Women's History and New York State History.

Former Town Justice leads Public Defender's Office



The town congratulates West Hurley resident Elizabeth Corrado on her appointment as Ulster County Public Defender.

Corrado (pictured at left) most recently was an Assistant Public Defender for the county and is a former Hurley Town Justice.

Her appointment to lead the Ulster County Public Defender's Office was announced on Feb. 22 by County Executive Jen Metzger and sent to the county Legislature for approval.

Metzger, in announcing the appointment, called Corrado a "highly skilled attorney and manager" who possesses the appropriate "temperament and vision" to lead the Public Defender's Office.

Outdoor brush burning banned in NY through May 14



New York's annual ban on the outdoor burning of residential brush began March 16 and will remain in effect through May 14, according to the state Department of Environmental Conservation.

Fires in backyard pits are allowed, as are campfires less than 3 feet in height and 4 feet in length, width or diameter. Small cooking fires also are allowed.

The brush-burning ban, which aims to reduce the risk of wildfires, has been enforced in New York State every spring since 2009.

Open burning is the greatest cause of wildfires in New York. Since the spring ban was implemented 14 years ago, wildfires in the state have decreased by more than 40%, according to the DEC.

Home-delivered meals available for seniors



Ulster County seniors can have frozen meals delivered to their homes at no cost.

The Office for the Aging program has its meals planned by a registered dietitian. Each meal provides one-third of a senior's daily nutritional needs.

A week's worth of meals is delivered once per week.

Those receiving the meals must be 60 or older and live in Ulster County, and must have difficulty preparing their own meals.

Stream Explorers Youth Adventure to be held April 15



Registration is open for the Ashokan Watershed Stream Management Program's 2023 Stream Explorers Youth Adventure, which will be held Saturday, April 15.

The free event is for children in grades 3 through 7 who live in Ashokan Watershed communities, which include the town of Hurley.

Participants will meet at the Ashokan Center, 477 Beaverkill Road, Olivebridge, at 8:30 a.m. The event runs through 4 p.m. Morning snacks, lunch and afternoon snacks will be provided.

The young people will use science models to learn about how streams work, investigate stream ecosystems, and learn to use science tools to assess stream health. They also will play water-related games.

There is no cost to participate, but space is limited and preregistration is required by April 6 (maximum of two children per family). To sign up, go to the website tinyurl.com/yab278h7 or email Dani White at daw287@cornell.edu. White also should be made aware of any special needs.

WHAT TO BRING

Participants should be prepared for a variety of weather conditions by dressing in layers with an all-weather jacket and appropriate shoes (no open-toed shoes). They also should bring stream boots, but boots will be provided for those who don't have their own.

Also to bring: A reusable water bottle (no glass please), bug repellant and sunscreen. All other supplies and equipment will be provided by the organizers.
