Hurley elections

Voters make changes in town government

Hurley residents in November elected a Town Supervisor, two Town Board members, a Town Clerk, a Highway Superintendent and two Town Justices.

Michael Boms, currently a Board member, was elected Supervisor. The two Board seats on the ballot were won by Diana Cline and incumbent Gregory Simpson. Town Clerk Annie Reed and Highway Superintendent Michael Shultis were re-elected, as were Town Justices Roy Hochberg and John Parker.

AROUND THE TOWN HALL: Info from our departments

Assessor's Office: The Assessor's Office reminds Hurley residents that property tax bills will be sent out by the Town Clerk's office in January.

If you need to update your mailing address, changes must be made with the Assessor's Office by calling (845) 331-7474, ext.4.

Building Department: The Town of Hurley is looking to hire a part-time Municipal Code Officer/Stormwater Management Officer.

The pay will be commensurate with experience, and a clean record and valid driver's license are required.

Town Clerk's Office: The Town Clerk's Office is finalizing the installation of an online payment portal for property taxes and other fees.

The new system should be up and running on the Town website, townofhurley.org, by Jan. 1, 2024, allowing Hurley residents to look up their tax bills and pay them online.

Board OKs 6 resolutions

The Town Board approved six resolutions, all by unanimous votes of 5-0, during its meeting on Thursday, Nov. 16, 2023, in the Town Hall.

The resolutions pertained to the purchase of traffic-calming speed humps for Joys Lane;

drainage improvements on Woodland Drive and Kemble Terrace; improvements to the Town Park in West Hurley; hiring a full-time Building Inspector; hiring a part-time Deputy Clerk; and seeking a Building Decarbonization Grant.

The New York State Department of Public Service offers a wide range of winter preparedness recommendations on its website. The site includes, among other things, energy conservation suggestions and information about financial assistance for heating costs.

Flood-relief loans available

The U.S. Small Business Administration has announced that, in Ulster and 18 other New York counties, Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) are available for small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small companies engaged in aquaculture, and most private nonprofits that suffered economic losses due to flooding and heavy rain from June 13 to July 31, 2023.

The EIDL program serves eligible farm-related and nonfarm-related entities that suffered financial losses as a direct result of natural disasters. The loan amount can be up to \$2 million, with interest

rates of 4% for small businesses and 2.375% for private nonprofits, and terms of up to 30 years. Payments start a year after the first disbursement.

The SBA sets loan amounts and terms based on each applicant's financial condition. Eligibility is based on the size of the applicant, type of activity, and its financial resources. The loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable, and other bills that could have been paid had the disaster not occurred. The loans are not intended to replace lost sales or profits.

Free COVID-19 test kits available at Town Hall

The Town of Hurley has received at-home COVID-19 tests from the Ulster County Department of Health, and they're available to pick up for free at the Town Hall, 10 Wamsley Place.

Each box contains two Antigen Rapid Tests – which render results in 15 minutes – and an instruction sheet.

The test packages (pictured) are on a table in the main hallway of the Town Hall, and there are more in the Town Clerk's Office. N-95 face masks also are available for free.



Hurley's supply of the tests and masks is plentiful, but please do not take more than you need for your household.

The Town Hall will be closed Monday, Dec. 25 (Christmas Day) and Monday, Jan. 1 (New Year's Day). The Transfer Station, which is closed every Monday, will be closed the Tuesdays immediately after the holidays.
