Meeting called to order at 6 p.m. by Supervisor Boms

Supervisor Boms says financial report for January 2024 and minutes from last two Town Board meetings (Jan. 23, 2024, and Feb. 13, 2024) are delayed; says January and February financial will be presented at a Town Board meeting in March 2024.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Phil Sinagra Sr. – Wants crews to tend to messy lawns and add charges to property owners' taxes; opposes making Schoolhouse Lane a one-way street; suggests Stop sign at Schoolhouse Lane and Russell Road.

Kathy Donlon – Asks board to make solving water and drainage problem a priority.

Julian Shapiro – Expresses concerns about safety of pedestrians, including youngsters waiting for school buses, on Zandhoek Road.

Peter Humphries – Favors free Transfer Station permits for Town committee volunteers but says program should start until 2025; expressed concern regarding staff; notes that Town Recreation Committee hasn't "always been" going on, as stated in resolution.

Meg Carey – Speaks in favor of Zero Waste initiative.

CLIMATE SMART/ELECTRIFICATION PRESENTATION. Kristen Schara made a presentation and discussed funding sources prior to introducing Tom Konrad, who provided a presentation on alternative heat sources and available funding/Central Hudson grants. Highway Superintendent Mike Shultis – Says department is transitioning to construction season, salt shed needs to be refurbished, trees will be trimmed on roads to be paved, unhappy with new shipment of blacktop, favors blacktop plant proposed for Route 28, hoping for spring weather early, has given preliminary contract for new Highway Garage to Town Board (wants new garage to last at least 50 years), says Town Planner Bonnie Franson is on board with garage plan, hopes to have 284 Agreement for Town Board at next meeting.

Joan Paccione, Chairperson, Conservation Advisory Council – Received a grant for \$36,000 from the DEC and Hudson River Estuary program to help with the creation of a Natural Inventory part of this will be developed thru a survey which will be included on the Town website and postcard mailing by end of 2024.
