Korean War Veterans Highway

WHEREAS the Town of Hurley Judges have requested a pay increase of one dollar an hour (\$1.00), current hourly rate is \$14.40 for the Town of Hurley Court Clerk and

WHEREAS The Town of Hurley Court has been increasing its volume of case loads annually. So the request to add up to an additional 5 hours a week if needed to complete this extra work load. With a maximum of 25 hours a week.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Hurley increase from \$14.40 to \$15.40, and allow an increase of up to 5 extra hours a week to Erma Moore. These increases would take effect starting 2/1/2019 through 12/31/2019.
