Presentation

Highway Garage plan – Highway Superintendent Mike Shultis and Consulting Engineer Dennis Larios, John Brust of Delaware Engineering

Highlights:

- Proposed site not on recreation land, not an archaeological dig site, no artifacts present
- Site is 5-7 acres, uphill from old garage on Dug Hill Road
- New Town Hall could someday be built on same site
- Current rented garage space costing \$74K to \$84K per year
- Larios says he's "comfortable" with site
- Old garage can't be reused because of proximity to Superfund site (former landfill)
- Entire process, including construction, could take 2 to 3 years
- Brust shows examples of company's previous garage projects
- Shultis favor keeping temperature in bays at 50 degrees F

Resolution

\$25,000 contract with Delaware Engineering for first phase of garage project – Approved 5-0
