- 7. Newsletters are at the printers and should be mailed out soon.
- 8. We received a check for the Comprehensive Plan grant for \$15, 000. Supervisor Bellows wanted to thank his secretary Dale Whipple for her hard work and many hours on this project.
- 9. The town Board is going to look at the water issue on Route 28A. There are now two residents with the water problem. There has been some mention that NYC DEP will help out so we will wait to see what they offer to do.
- 10. We are hoping the county will talk to the town about the guard rail on Main St. and what the alternatives are.
- 11. The Town Board will be looking at the logging law, OWB and leaf pick-up over the next couple months.
- 12. Superintendent Russell does not feel that the money being offered to the town to take over the plowing of county roads would work with his current staff. Supervisor Bellows thought maybe taking on small roads that would not delay the highway from plowing other town roads in a timely basis might be an alternative.
