An Agenda meeting of the Town Board was held at the Town Hall on Nov. 19, 2007, 7:00 PM (T-9)

Presiding: Supervisor Michael Shultis

Attending: Councilman John Gill, Councilwoman Barbara Zell, Councilwoman Janet Briggs, Highway Superintendent Linda Cook, Historian David Baker, Solid Waste Manager James Craven and 41 members of the public.

1. OLD TOWN BOARD BUSINESS:

- (A) Supervisor Shultis reported on the completion of Project "B". Minor problems were solved by the Hurley Highway Department.
- (B) Board members have received copies of Deborah Ferraro's resume, She applied for the part-time bookkeepers position. The Board had no questions.
- (C) Fire Commissioner Joseph Wisneski, of the West Hurley Fire District informed the Board that their drainage work tied in with Hurley's Project "B". He explained that the commissioners were applying for a "shared services grant" to repair/pave the parking lot and requested that Hurley be the co-sponsor.
- (D) Hurley has received a check for \$35,208.99 which is Hurley's portion of County taxes.
- (E) Supervisor Shultis asked for a vote to approve the 2008 preliminary budget.

(A) RESOLUTION #2007-190: WEST HURLEY FIRE DEPT. SHARED GRANT APPLICATION

Whereas, The West Hurley Fire District #1 is in need of improvements to its building located on Wall Street in West Hurley located in the Town of Hurley, Ulster County, New York and,

Whereas, The West Hurley Fire District #1 (WHFD) is authorizing Commissioner Joseph P. Wisneski to apply to the Department of State for a Shared Municipal Services Grant to repair the drainage problem on the district property located on Wall Street in West Hurley, in which he will be the lead contact person concerning this grant application. Commissioner Joseph P. Wisneski is authorized to execute all financial and/or administrative processes relating to the grant program.

Whereas, the project titled "WHFD Co#I Drainage Project" will work in conjunction with the Town of Hurley Storm Water Drainage project "8" which is a project to repair storm water problems in the West Hurley area. TheWHFD Co#I Drainage Project will repair the sinking parking area, the flooding ambulance garage area, and the flooding problem in the crawlspace area of the district owned building. The Town of Hurley Storm Water Drainage Project "8" will extend a drainage pipe approximately forty (40) feet in which the WHFD Co#I Drainage Project will be able to release its ground and storm water into. This fire district building improvement project is being done at this time due to Town of Hurley improving the storm water drainage in the West Hurley Area. The Town of Hurley Drainage Project "B" is a capital improvement project which is a part of the Town of Hurley Comprehensive Plan. and,

Whereas, the continuation of the WHFD Co#I Drainage Project will included the repaving of approximately 6500 square feet of binding material and 14500 square feet of

top coating blacktop material for its parking area in the spring of 2008 in which the Town of Hurley will assist with equipment, manpower and other resources. and,

Whereas, the amount of the grant being applied for by the West Hurley Fire District #1 is

\$ 47,700.00 with the cost of, as described in the Shared Municipal Services Grant Program 2007-08 to the fire district to be 10% of the total project. The amount of \$5,300.00 will be expended from the fire district budget. Total project estimate is \$53,000.00

Therefore be it resolved, The Town of Hurley will continue with shared services to assist the fire district with its WHFD Co#I Drainage Project.

Councilwoman Briggs said she was concerned that the workers would not approve. Councilman Gill said that no county representative was present to explain this county proposal. Highway Superintendent Cook said this will cause union problems. She also felt that the county was not forthcoming and that there was another agenda to the resolution.

Ulster Countywide Shared Service Feasibility Study and Implementation Plan and as coapplicant, ensures government representation and participation in the study's development and implementation.

Jean Clancy requested that the town attorney look into the legality of a disturbance of wetlands, known as the Millbrook, west of Overlook/Russell Rd and east of Hillside/Orchard Street. She said that a road being constructed will raise the water table and disturb the area.
