Town Board Business

1. Dave Sheeley will be checking the requirements for the new guard rail on Hurley Ave four corners.
2. ZBA appointments were made at the agenda meeting for Abby Gross, Danielle Hundley and Anne Kelly.
3. Walkway over the Hudson flags will be brought to the town hall to put on display.
4. Councilman Gill said that we are still waiting for two easements on Eagles Nest.
5. Town residents can go the mybenefits.ny.gov to check eligibility for benefits.
6. H1N1 info on our website and posted on the town hall bulletin board
7. The 2010 town budget was passed at the agenda meeting. The increase will be 9% which is about \$31.61 increase for \$200,000 home and \$4.20 over the past two years since last year there was a decrease.
8. A snow plow for a highway truck was passed at the Agenda meeting
9. We received an energy brochure from the Public Service Commission. It is available at the town hall for anyone interested. There are some good tips on how to save on your energy bills.
10. Time Warner is now available on Baker, Skea Route 28A and Tebilt Road.
11. Hurley 350th Anniversary will be n ext year. Soon we will form a committee for the celebration.
12. The DEP put in a drain on the Heinitz property on Route 28A where. Water is still coming from back of their property. We asked if Brinnier and Larios would get together with Mike Kight to give them some assistance.
13. We received a letter from a property owner about the OWB law. His property does not meet the setbacks and he asked for a waiver from the Town Board.
14. Lions Club would like to hold a free eye screening for children 1 to 5 years. When we set a date and time we will let the public know.

From Depts.

1. Councilman Gill said that the portable radios at the highway are shot and they found a good deal on 4 used ones from Hudson River Radio @ \$150.00 per radio, new ones would be \$450.00 each. The total would be \$575.00 with 6 pack battery charger. They were going to check to see if they would offer any guarantee before they went ahead with the purchase.

The town wants to get an estimate on concrete and culture stone to replace the bluestone for the town park entrance.

Also we need a place to store the snow blower at the town hall. The suggestion was to buy a small baby barn.

Charles O'Keefe did cement work on the side of the town hall and put in a new door jam on the side door.

The salt shed has a lot of wear and tear on it and we might need to look into a new one in the spring.

2. Superintendent Russell said that he had surplus equipment at the highway and would have a resolution at the next meeting.

3. Virginia Starke said that the public meeting would be in January on the results of the ground water study for West Hurley and Glenford.

Diana Cline said there were still seats available for the NYC trip on Dec. 12th.

From the Floor:

Phil Sinagra said that there would be a free Thanksgiving dinner at the Salvation Army on Cedar St. from 11 to 1.

Pat Manley has a problem with the constant smoke from the burning in her neighborhood. Also still has a drainage problem. The town is going to schedule a meeting with Dennis Larios.
