- A7110.1 Parks PS decrease \$20,000. to \$7,000.
- A7110.4Parks Contractual \$5000 to \$15000.
- \$6,700. to build girls softball field at Dughill Park
- \$13,000 to bring Town technology up to 21st century
- \$9,800 to CAC to pay for consulting fees to update Comprehensive Plan.
