A. What is the Waste channel?

The waste channel runs from the Ashokan Screen Chamber to the Little Beaver Kill and then the old Esopus Creek bed before it joins the Esopus Creek.

It provides ability to release water from Ashokan Reservoir to the old Esopus Stream bed. **B. Why is it important**?

Provides ability to waste the turbid waters entering the west basin from the upper Esopus Creek to ensure better quality water

Use of the waste channel for water quality purpose provides an additional benefit helping to create a void in the west basin to capture runoff

Provides ability to release water from the Ashokan Reservoir for Dam safety **C. How is it used?**

Coordination is made with Ashokan Field Campus, AFI and notifications are made to the UC EMO, downstream Supervisors, Kingston and Saugerties prior to wasting water Monitored 24 hrs per day from WSCC and physical inspections 2x per day

7. Lester Hornig sent a letter thanking the Highway crew for a great job done in West Hurley.8. The Town Board said it was ok for Supervisor Bellows to start filling out the paper work for solar panels for the town hall using the grant we received from Senator Bonacic.

9. The Lions Club will be putting the new LED lights on the Christmas tree on Saturday.10. Time Warner Cable Contract is up for renewal.

11. We are still struggling with the OWB law because of the ever changing environment. There are new stoves coming out and the board feels we should not restrict someone in the future. We are looking to change the orderly process of the law to go before the zoning and planning board.
